Third Tri-State Weather Conference, October 9th 2010, Danbury, Connecticut

The third Tri-State Weather Conference will be held on Saturday, October 9th 2010 in the Science Building on the mid-town campus of Western Connecticut State University in Danbury, CT. The conference is presented by the Meteorology Program at Western Connecticut State University and co-sponsored by the WestConn Student Chapter of the AMS, the New York City/Long Island Chapter of the AMS, NOAA/National Weather Service/Upton/NYC, NY. The purpose of the conference is to enhance education, professional development and communication among private and public sector meteorologists, researchers, educators, students, emergency management officials, and weather enthusiasts.

Submissions, in the form of oral presentations or posters, are being solicited on high impact weather events that affect the Tri-State region of New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut. Potential topics would include, but are not limited to, nor'easters and winter weather, severe thunderstorms, tropical weather and hurricanes, climate change, and mesoscale meteorology. We are especially interested in presentations about the snow event of February 10th 2010 and the Winter Storm from February 25-27, 2010. The deadline for abstracts is June 1st 2010.
